Francis Piche Invitational –

The Francis Piche Invitational was to be held at Gunstock Ski Area on March 11th through the 15th. The event was cancelled after the first two training days. This year's PARA quota originally consisted of a total of 40 racers. This year's quota was allocated as 11 U12 boys, 11 U12 girls, 9 U14 boys and 9 U14 girls.

PARA was to send a total of 24 U12 racers after the quota was expanded. The team consisted of the 20 state team members along with two additional girls and two additional boys. The event was to consist of two optional training days on Wednesday and Thursday, a Dual Slalom/Team event on Friday, GS race on Saturday and a slalom race on Sunday.

Future Stars Festival -

NYSSRA was going to hold two-day event at Gore Mountain, NY. The event, which was skills based, was open to a total of 100 athletes from NYSSRA, SARA, Tri-State, NJSRA and PARA. Prior to the event being cancelled PARA had commitments from 19 racers.

The quota was initially open to state team members but opened to all U12 racers after many state team members declined. Racers were offered slots based on overall derby results.

I received, for the most part, positive feedback the last three years about this event from both parents and racers. However, fielding a team continues to be somewhat of a challenge for various reasons including the event date (late season).

Eastern Region U12 Skills & Duals Project

The U12 Project was held at NWAC on February 19th and 20th. The intent of the project is to bring U12 racers from the northeast together for a camp focused on skill development, tactics and technique. The camp consists of training courses and dual slalom and GS courses. PARA sent a total of 18 racers.

The environments (over 15 different ones) provided the athletes an opportunity to focus on discipline specific goals like pole planting, transition, pressue in the fall line, edge angles, clean carving, to name a few.

Each afternoon session, the athletes got to go head to head in a pro
style dual with a jump! PARA was well represented!
